## News

On 23 February 2023, CEPOL, in its capacity as outgoing Presidency of the EU Justice and Home Affairs Agencies' Network (JHAAN), published the final [activity report](#) for the year 2022. Agencies in the network include CEPOL, EIGE, EMCDDA, EUAA, eu-LISA, Eurojust, Europol, FRA, and Frontex (→ [euclid](#) 1/22, 35-36).

As the first Presidency of the newly established Trio Presidency (with CEPOL holding the Presidency in 2022, EUAA in 2023, and eu-LISA in 2024), CEPOL focused on implementation of the recommendations of the 2021 JHAAN [Assessment Report](#). Emphasis was also placed on the joint priorities of the Trio Presidency for the years 2022-2024, i.e. digitalisation, business continuity, and implementation of the principles of the European Green Deal. Russia's military aggression in Ukraine had a strong impact on the year's activities.

As of 1 January 2023, the European Union Agency of Asylum (EUAA) has taken over the [Presidency](#) of the JHAAN. For the year 2023, in addition to continuing to support Ukraine, the [priority topics](#) defined by the EUAA include the following:

- Digitalisation;
- Implementating the EU Green Deal in Justice and Home Affairs Agencies;
- Cybersecurity;
- Providing information in mixed migration situations;
- Increasing communication and improving general awareness of the JHAAN network.
