- Legislative package on the interoperability of EU information systems in the area of justice and home affairs (see [euclid 3/2018, p. 157](#));

- Amendment of the Visa Information System;
- Proposal for a Regulation on preventing the dissemination of terrorist content online (see [euclid 4/2018, p. 199](#));
- Directive on non-cash payment fraud (see [euclid 1/2018, p. 17](#));
- Regulation on European Production and Preservation Orders – the e-evidence regulation (see [euclid 4/2018, p. 206](#)).
