Compiling contributions from academics, legal practitioners, and officials from public authorities, the collective book "Strengthening the Future of the European Public Prosecutor's Office" is available open access in the library of publisher *Nomos*. The contributions build on discussions held during workshops at the *Villa Vigoni*, Lago di Como, which is part of the German-Italian Centre for European Dialogue (see the conference report by *L. Jakobi* and *G. Theodorakakou* in *euclid* 1/2025, 51-62).

The publication, edited by *Dominik Brodowski* and *Sebastian Trautmann*, provides substantive insights into the work, constraints and role of the EPPO in the EU area of freedom, security and justice within the current framework. It also offers suggestions for the institution's future positioning. They may feed into the upcoming EU-level discussion about adjusting the 2017 EPPO Regulation.
