At the end of February 2022, the European Agency for Fundamental Rights (FRA) published an [information video](#) on how to tackle disinformation on the Internet. The practical guide consists of six key messages:

- To convey messages of hope instead of fear;
- To identify why a source is spreading information;
- To use personal storytelling to counter us-versus-them narratives;
- To find new ways to reach the targeted audience;
- To encourage the audience to help share reliable information;
- To stay one step ahead of disinformation campaigns.
